This unique degree program provides a comprehensive education in accounting, audit, and information technology to produce graduates who possess the skills needed in the global business environment. The program addresses the need for professional accountants and auditors with information technology expertise and combines theory, integrated applied projects, and paid co-op work terms. Our degree meets the undergraduate educational requirements for direct entry into the Chartered Professional Accountants (CPA) Professional Education Program (PEP), which is part of an individual's path to obtaining their full CPA designation.

Becoming a Journeyperson: Skilled workers (journeypersons) are in high demand in a broad range of occupations and make an important contribution to Canada's economic growth. If you are interested in becoming a journeyperson, you must first complete an apprenticeship. Women are encouraged to investigate the significant benefits of a career in a skilled occupation.

Apprenticeship: Apprenticeship is an agreement between an individual who wants to learn a skill and an employer who needs a skilled worker. It is a combination of in-school training and on-the-job experience. An apprenticeship can last two to five years, depending on the program. About 90% of the apprentice's time is spent learning practical skills on the job while supervised by a qualified journeyperson. The rest is spent learning theoretical and technical aspects of the trade. Over time, the apprenticeship system of training has proven to be one of the world's most successful ways to learn.

On-the-Job Experience: Once you have decided which occupation best suits your interests and talents, it is up to you to find an employer willing to employ you as an apprentice.



Apprenticeship

Becoming a Journeyperson: Skilled workers (journeypersons) are in high demand in a broad range of occupations and make an important contribution to Canada's economic growth. If you are interested in becoming a journeyperson, you must first complete an apprenticeship. Women are encouraged to investigate the significant benefits of a career in a skilled occupation.

Apprenticeship: Apprenticeship is an agreement between an individual who wants to learn a skill and an employer who needs a skilled worker. It is a combination of in-school training and on-the-job experience. An apprenticeship can last two to five years, depending on the program. About 90% of the apprentice's time is spent learning practical skills on the job while supervised by a qualified journeyperson. The rest is spent learning theoretical and technical aspects of the trade. Over time, the apprenticeship system of training has proven to be one of the world's most successful ways to learn.

On-the-Job Experience: Once you have decided which occupation best suits your interests and talents, it is up to you to find an employer willing to employ you as an apprentice.

In-School Training: Conestoga College provides the in-school training portion for a variety of skilled trades. You will be released from work to attend trade school either in a block or a one-day-a-week format, depending on the trade and delivery options.

Registration: Registration occurs after an employer is found. At that time, the employer or apprentice may call the local Apprenticeship and Client Services Office to request registration and have an agreement prepared. Once you are a registered apprentice and have received your Offer of Classroom Training Form, classroom training fees apply. Applicants are registered on a first-come, first-served basis. All apprentices in Ontario are required to be a member in good standing with the Ontario College of Trades www.collegeoftrades.ca. 

The health-care industry is continually evolving, posing new challenges and opportunities for change. Emergency room wait times, patient access to quality care, and the electronic availability of health records are all at the forefront of this emerging field. Our degree program provides you with the knowledge and skills in health informatics and information management to make a difference at the broader, strategic level. They track and evaluate the best use of resources and contribute to improving the usefulness of new e-health software within health-care organizations and by software vendors. Four-year Academic Co-operative Bachelor's degree program

Location: Doon (Kitchener) Campus

Start: September



This program provides students with the skills to analyze the reasons for crime and the various approaches to crime prevention, as well as the means to support healthy and safe communities. It emphasizes the importance of inter-agency and inter-professional collaboration in addressing both individual and societal issues related to crime. Students develop strong problem-solving skills, systemic/critical thinking and interpersonal communication skills to become leaders within the community justice and criminal justice systems. Graduates are prepared to research, initiate, implement, and evaluate social policy and programs. Students participate in a co-op placement within probation and parole offices, correctional facilities, treatment facilities, police services, various residential centres and other community justice agencies benefiting from the strong base of community programs already existing within the Region of Waterloo.

Graduates of other criminal justice/social service programs should contact the program coordinator for information regarding their eligibility for advanced standing.





Location: Doon (Kitchener) Campus and Waterloo Wellington Flight Centre or Great Lakes Helicopter

This program is a collaboration between Conestoga College and the Waterloo Wellington Flight Centre and Great Lakes Helicopter. Students in this program will take classes at Conestoga College as well as at the Waterloo Wellington Flight Centre or Great Lakes Helicopter, depending on whether they have chosen the fixed-wing or rotary-wing option. Graduates will receive a diploma in General Arts and Science, as well as the pilot training to allow them to undertake the Transport Canada commercial pilot licence testing. Students must be available during the summer between first and second year to complete their flying hours.

Graduate Opportunities

- Employers in aviation are increasingly seeking pilots with post-secondary education as well as the required licences.
- If a student does not pursue or complete the flight-centre training, he/she, in conjunction with the program coordinator, may choose other academic and vocational courses to fulfill the General Arts and Science Diploma requirements.
- Graduates can find initial employment with a variety of air operators, typically flying single engine aircraft. Some graduates will go on to complete a Flight Instructor rating and then work at a flying school teaching others. 

Apprenticeship

Becoming a Journeyman: Skilled workers (journeymen) are in high demand in a broad range of occupations and make an important contribution to Canada's economic growth. If you are interested in becoming a journeyman, you must first complete an apprenticeship. Women are encouraged to investigate the significant benefits of a career in a skilled occupation.

Apprenticeship: Apprenticeship is an agreement between an individual who wants to learn a skill and an employer who needs a skilled worker. It is a combination of in-school training and on-the-job experience. An apprenticeship can last two to five years, depending on the program. About 90% of the apprentice's time is spent learning practical skills on the job while supervised by a qualified journeyman. The rest is spent learning theoretical and technical aspects of the trade. Over time, the apprenticeship system of training has proven to be one of the world's most successful ways to learn.

On-the-Job Experience: Once you have decided which occupation best suits your interests and talents, it is up to you to find an employer willing to employ you as an apprentice.

In-School Training: Conestoga College provides the in-school training portion for a variety of skilled trades. You will be released from work to attend trade school either in a block or a one-day-a-week format, depending on the trade and delivery options.

Registration: Registration occurs after an employer is found. At that time, the employer or apprentice may call the local Apprenticeship and Client Services Office to request registration and have an agreement prepared. Once you are a registered apprentice and have received your Offer of Classroom Training Form, classroom training fees apply. Applicants are registered on a first-come, first-served basis. All apprentices in Ontario are required to be a member in good standing with the Ontario College of Trades www.collegeoftrades.ca. 



Admission

Processing of your application will begin as soon as your application form, application fee and supporting documents are received. Generally, admission to most Conestoga programs requires:

- An Ontario Secondary School Diploma or equivalent (usually graduation from secondary school in most countries)
- Grade 12 mathematics or equivalent (usually mathematics at the senior level in secondary school for most programs)
- Grade 12 English or equivalent (usually English at the senior level in secondary school or minimum test score on an appropriate English language proficiency test – see below).

Minimum English language test scores for most diploma and certificate programs (except Practical Nursing, Hearing Instrument Specialist and the Public Relations diploma): IELTS overall band of 6 with no bands less than 5.5; TOEFL iBT 80. For degree and graduate certificate programs and the Practical Nursing diploma, the Hearing Instrument Specialist diploma, and the Public Relations diploma: IELTS overall band of 6.5 with no bands less than 6.0; (Please note: For the Hearing Instrument Specialist program, applicants must have an overall band of 6.5 with no band less than 6.0 except the speaking band which must be 8.0.) TOEFL iBT 88. Please see our website for other acceptable English language proficiency test scores.

The Conestoga Language Institute offers a four-semester English for Academic Studies (EAS) program designed to provide the listening, speaking, reading and writing skills necessary for post-secondary studies.



How to Apply – Full-time Programs

Domestic Applicants

1. Choose your full-time program.

 - A \$95 fee per application must be paid at the time of application.
 - You can apply for a total of five full-time programs, but no more than three full-time programs at any one college.
 - Conestoga College code is CONS.

3. Transcripts - forward all documents to ontariocolleges.ca. Please note: Some exceptions apply. Please see the “Apply Now” information on individual program web pages.

International Applicants

International visa students must provide the following documents for admission to Conestoga College:

1. Online application submission International Application Form.
2. Online payment of application fee using credit card or debit card. Alternate methods include: waiver code, money order/bank draft (payable to Conestoga College), web banking, Western Union transfer or direct payment at the international office.

4. A copy of TOEFL or IELTS examination results or another recognized international test of English meeting the requirements for the program to which you apply.*

Academic Upgrading

Mature Student Definition

A mature student is a student who does not hold an Ontario Secondary School Diploma (or equivalent), and who is at least 19 years of age as of the first day of classes. An applicant who possesses an OSSD, regardless of age or number of years out of high school, will be considered on the basis of the OSSD: mature student status does not apply. If specific subject requirements are indicated, all applicants must possess those subject requirements regardless of whether they are applying as mature students; college, university and upgrading equivalencies may be used if applicants do not possess the appropriate subject requirements. Mature students applying to certificates, diplomas, and advanced diplomas must demonstrate their potential to work at the post-secondary level in one of two ways:

- by successfully completing equivalency testing in English and/or mathematics; or
- by completing a program of academic upgrading at a level appropriate to the program of choice.

Pre-Admission Assessments

If you do not have the mathematics, English, chemistry or biology credit required for admission to the certificate, diploma, or advanced diploma of your choice, you can write a college pre-admission assessment. The assessments are offered most Tuesdays and Wednesdays at the Doon Campus, 299 Doon Valley Drive, Kitchener in the Assessment Centre, Room 2A210. 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
